Advice-Centred Review Sheet (Guided Questions from Bean, 1996)<sup>11</sup>

1.	What is the question, problem, or issue that the draft addresses?
2.	What is the writer's thesis statement?
3.	Are there any confusing ideas in the draft? Note them with wavy lines in the margins.
4.	What are the strengths and weaknesses of the writer's ideas?
5.	Are there sufficient supporting details, such as data, statistics, quotations, references and personal examples?
6.	What are the things that you think are particularly strong about this draft? Name at least two.
