




Step 2: Submitting your Draft 1 plan or Draft 2 through Turnitin on the homepage

On the corresponding course home page, you should see the following in the main window. Click on "Draft 1&2 Submissions + Feedback".












- 1. Assignments in Microsoft Word format are preferred for giving feedback on.

- 4. Every new attempt (submission) will override the previous one, so please make sure all submission file(s) is/are included in each SINGLE attempt.




Step 3: Submitting your Draft 2 feedback reflection

Step 4: Viewing your ELC teacher's feedback


To read your ELC teacher's comments, go to the "Draft Submission & Feedback" page.




